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#### ORDER

##### MODIFICATION OF CODE OF FAIR COMPETITION FOR THE LAUNDRY TRADE

WHEREAS, the Code of Fair Competition for the Laundry Trade, approved by the President of the United States on February 16, 1934, provides in its Executive Order that

“The said Code of Fair Competition be and is hereby approved for a period of ninety (90) days, within which period the adequacy of the minimum wages established in this Code shall be given further study by the Administrator . . .”, and

WHEREAS, said Code further provides that a report and recommendations on the adequacy of said minimum wages, shall be submitted by me to the President, and

WHEREAS, the said Code has been extended for an additional period of thirty (30) days, which extension was not a sufficient extension of time to enable me to determine the adequacy of said minimum wages;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Hugh S. Johnson, Administrator for Industrial Recovery, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Executive Orders of the President of the United States, including Executive Order Number 6543-A, dated December 30, 1933, and otherwise, do hereby modify said Code by extending its date of termination for an additional period of ninety (90) days.

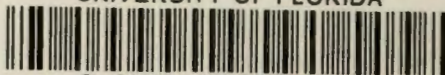

ORDER

Manufacturers of Goods Made or Produced in the United States  
 WHEREAS, the Code of Fair Competition for the Laundry  
 Trade approved by the Federal Trade Commission on February  
 10, 1924, provides in its Executive Order No. 1262  
 "The said Code of Fair Competition is hereby approved  
 for a period of three (3) years, within which period the necessary  
 of the minimum goods included in the Code shall be given further  
 study by the Administration," and  
 WHEREAS, said Code further provides "It is the duty and responsibility  
 of the Department in the carrying out and enforcement of said Code to  
 submit by me to the President  
 WHEREAS, the said Code has been extended for an additional  
 period of three (3) years, which extension was not a sufficient  
 extension in time to enable the Department to make a study of the  
 minimum goods included in the Code, and  
 NOW, THEREFORE, I, Frank D. Roosevelt, President of the United States,  
 do hereby extend by virtue of this Executive Order the said Code of  
 Fair Competition for the Laundry Trade, Executive Order No. 1262, and  
 Executive Order Number 1262-A, which extends the term of  
 said Code of Fair Competition and Code of Extension for the  
 minimum goods included in the Code for an additional period of three (3) years.
