of Florida; and in general to exercise such powers as may be incident or convenient to its purposes or businesses and to carry on such operations and enterprises and to do all such things in connection therewith as may be lawful.

ARTICLE III.

The amount of capital stock authorized shall be one hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000.00), divided into one thousand shares of the part value of one hundred dollars (\$100.00) each. The capital stock may be payable either wholly or in part, in cash, or may be issued or used, either wholly or in part, for the purchase of property, patents, contracts, labor or services at a just valuation thereof, to be fixed by the Board of Directors at a meeting to be called for that purpose.

ARTICLE IV.

The term for which this corporation is to exist shall be ninety-nine years.

ARTICLE V.

The business of said corporation shall be managed by a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and a Board of Directors consisting of not less than three nor more than thirteen members, the number to be fixed by the by-laws of the company. The offices of secretary and treasurer may be held by the same person. The annual meeting for the election of

Directors by the stockholders of the company shall be held on the second Wednesday in June of each year. The date of the annual meeting may be changed by the by-laws. The Directors shall elect all other officers at a meeting to be held as soon as possible after the adjournment of the annual meeting. The stockholders shall meet on the first day of June, 1909, being the first annual meeting, in Room 304 Law Exchange Building in the City of Jacksonville, Florida, for the purpose of perfecting the organization of the corporation, adopting by-laws, electing directors and the transacting of such other business as may come before the meeting. Until the officers elected at the first election shall be qualified, the businesses of this corporation shall be conducted by the following named officers: R. W. Mattox, President; D. H. McMillan, Vice-President; P. L. Sutherland, Secretary and Treasurer, and R. W. Mattox, D. H. McMillan and P. L. Sutherland, directors.

ARTICLE VI.

The highest amount of indebtedness or liability to which the corporation may at any time subject itself shall be \$500,000.00.

ARTICLE VII.

The name and residences of the subscribing incorporators of the said corpor-

ation, together with the number of shares of its capital stock subscribed by each are as follows:
