# VERDICT OF GUILTY IN N. S. CASE.

Individuals are All Convicted Excepted C. J. DeLoach

(Special.)

Savannah, May 10.—“Guilty,” was the verdict brought in late tonight by the jury in the case of the so-called “Turpentine Trust,” though peculiarly the names of the two indicted corporations are omitted, and the verdict applies only to the five individual defendants, E. S. Nash, president of the American Naval Stores Company; Spencer P. Shotton, chairman of its board of directors; George Meade Boardman of New York, its treasurer, and J. E. C. Myers, vice-president of the company, and Carl Moller of Jacksonville, Fla., manager of the company and also Jacksonville manager of the National Transportation and Terminal Company. The sixth defendant, Charles J. DeLoach, was found not guilty at the direction of the court.

Unless deferred at the request of the defense, sentence will be passed to-morrow morning. A motion for a new trial

will be made.

The verdict finds the five individual defendants guilty on the first and second counts of the indictment. The third count was ordered stricken in the early stages of the trial. The first and second counts charge the defendants with conspiring to restrain interstate trade, and, second, with conspiring to monopolize interstate trade.

The jury does not mention either of the indicted corporations, the American Naval Stores Company and the National Transportation and Terminal Company.

The surprise the verdict caused in the court room and in Savannah was complete. It was generally believed that a verdict would favor the defense and that if it did not a recommendation to the mercy of the court would be made. The maximum sentence is a fine of \$5,000, and a term of one year in prison.

### PRESIDENT FINLEY ADVOCATES WISE FOREST MANAGEMENT.

“In my opinion,” said President Finley, “the economic importance of the management of our Southern forests so as to secure from them the largest present profit consistent with their preservation can not be overestimated. In addition to their influence upon stream flow, tending to diminish the destructiveness of floods and to maintain high water for navigation and for the generation of power in dry seasons, they form the foundation of our wood-working industries.

“Until comparatively recent years the North Atlantic States predominated in furniture manufacturing and other wood-working industries. Timber supplies in that section have been almost exhausted

and these industries are following the rapidly receding forests into the South and West, greatly increasing the value of our timber lands.

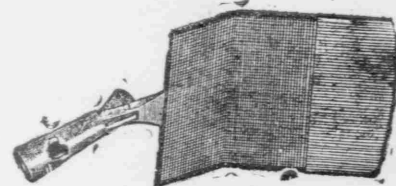
If Southern woodworking industries are to thrive in years to come, they must be assured of a constant supply of their raw material. This can be brought about only by the adoption of scientific methods of forestry by the owners of our woodlands.”
