## Bennett gets required petitions

Bennett to submit more than 1,000 signed petitions to place name on ballot, first mayoral candidate to do so.

ST. PETERSBURG – Mayoral candidate Jamie Bennett has submitted more than 1,000 signed petitions from voters throughout St. Petersburg to place his name on the upcoming ballot to run for Mayor. Bennett's is the first campaign to collect and turn in the requisite number of signed petitions to qualify for the September primary.

"It wasn't easy collecting so many petitions," said Bennett, "but I believe we have the hardest-working, most-organized campaign and this effort is a testament to that."

Bennett said he and his volunteers have spent the last two weeks working to collect enough signatures to put him over the top. "We've collected petitions from voters throughout this City, from the neighborhoods of Pinellas Point to Riviera Bay, from Pasadena Shores to Crescent Heights." Bennett said he collected the 1,000th petition sometime at the St. Paul's Festival or at Blues Fest.

Bennett has already begun to submit his petitions to the City Clerk's office so that the verification process could begin. He will continue to collect and submit petitions in case some petitions, as expected, are rejected because they cannot be read or the information does not match with current voter information.

"We've collected well more than 1,000 signatures because occasionally some petitions cannot be verified by the Supervisor of Elections," said Bennett, who also stated that Mayor Rick Baker signed one of his petitions. "I'm sure the Mayor agrees that everyone deserves the opportunity to be on the ballot," in St. Petersburg.

## Hundreds volunteer at Bay Pines

PINELLAS COUNTY – Over 400 people of all ages donned bright yellow T-shirts on Saturday as they pulled weeds, picked up litter, and painted at the Bay Pines VA.

The volunteers from Pinellas county worked simultaneously with over 55,000 volunteers across 11 southeastern states as part of Day of Service 2009, an effort to spread hope and relief through community service.

"There is tremendous unity in volunteers working together throughout the region on a single day

to impact our local communities. We're excited to be able to honor and serve our veterans" said Bill Schweikert, leader of the Seminole congregation of The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints that organized the Day of Service.

VA employees also donated their Saturday to oversee the Day of Service activities at Bay Pines. Together, the volunteers spread a tractor-trailer load of mulch, filled over 400 garbage bags with debris and leaves, laid bricks, and moved hundreds of boxes in the warehouse. Looking

over a lawn free of leaves and newly planted and mulched flowerbeds, Derenda McCook, who oversees volunteers at Bay Pines VA, noted the impact volunteers can have.

"Just think, 400 volunteers, working for 4 hours, that's 1600 hours," said McCook. "And all those smiling faces, what a difference that makes."

Many of those smiling faces were worn by 60 young children who presented the veterans with handmade thank-you cards and sang songs, such

## Florida ready for H1N1 flu

TALLAHASSEE – While no cases have been identified in Florida as of Thursday, cases of swine flu have been confirmed in the U.S., according to the federal Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. There are an undetermined number of cases in Mexico reaching into the hundreds.

"This is a situation where we must all be on the alert," said Dr. Ana Viamonte Ros, Florida's State Surgeon General. "We have increased our surveillance and we're telling doctors that since the flu season is waning, if they see patients with sudden onset high fever and a cough or sore throat, they should collect a specimen for testing."

Dr. Viamonte Ros said the Florida Department of Health has a response plan and has put it into play. "Our state laboratories have the equipment necessary and our personnel are trained in identifying influenza samples. We have increased surveillance, alerted doctors and are working with our local health departments," she said.

Swine influenza viruses are not transmitted by food and a person cannot get swine influenza from eating pork products. The infections appear to spread from person to person. Drugs called antivirals can reduce the consequences of contracting the flu, if taken early.

"We have plans in place for this kind of emergency," Dr. Viamonte Ros said.

## DEP settles Gulfstream violations

Gulfstream required to restore area and pay \$205,000 in penalties, costs, and environmental resource damages.

PINELLAS COUNTY – The Florida Department of Environmental Protection (DEP) has reached an agreement with Gulfstream Natural Gas Systems (Gulfstream) to resolve violations related to two unintentional releases of drilling mud that occurred

during the installation of a natural gas pipeline within the Pinellas County Aquatic Preserve, a Class II Outstanding Florida Waterbody.

Nearly one acre of seagrass beds was impacted by the releases and more than one half acre of seagrass sustained further damage from the grounding and removal of two tank barges used to clean up the released drilling mud.

The legal order imposes \$175,000 in penalties and costs to Gulfstream, plus DEP is requiring the company to

pay an additional \$30,000 for the environmental damages to Tampa Bay.

"Seagrass beds are essential not only to our precious marine life, but to the overall health of our economy," said DEP Southwest District Director Deborah Getzoff. "These penalties represent DEP's firm commitment to protecting Florida's natural resources. Fortunately, the seagrasses in this area have already begun to reestablish themselves."

Gulfstream has removed the drilling mud which is comprised of a

naturally occurring clay known as Bentonite. The mud is pumped through the drill pipe to lubricate and cool the drilling bit as it moves forward. A release occurs when too much pressure causes a fracture in the overlying material.

The company now has 30 days to pay its penalties and costs, and to submit a restoration plan to DEP that includes a detailed description of how Gulfstream intends to restore both the holes left behind by the drilling mud release, and the area dredged by

the grounding and removal of the barges.

Gulfstream has completed the 17.74 mile pipeline project which extends from the main pipeline in Manatee County to the Progress Energy power plant on Weedon Island. The pipeline will make it possible for the power plant to switch from burning fuel oil to using natural gas.

# Rays last in AL EAST

ST. PETERSBURG – The Rays will begin a six-game homestand on Thursday, April 30, as the Red Sox open a four-game series in Boston's first visit to Tropicana Field since last October's American League Championship Series.

The homestand concludes with a two-game set against the Baltimore Orioles.

The Rays have been struggling thus far this season, losing its series against the Mariners, Twins, and A's.

Tickets remain available for each game. There are a limited number of seats for the Saturday (May 2)

and Sunday (May 3) games against the Red Sox, but plenty of good seats are available for the remainder of the homestand. The Rays currently rank fourth in the American League in home attendance with an average of 28,986 after seven home dates. The Rays home attendance is 60 percent ahead of last season at the same time.

Tampa Bay Buccaneers Head Coach Raheem Morris will throw out the ceremonial first pitch prior to the Rays-Red Sox game on May 1

and left-handed pitcher Patrick Schuster, a senior at New Port

Richey's Mitchell High School, will throw out the first pitch on Sunday, May 3.

Mitchell recently threw a Florida State High School record four consecutive no-hitters.

The homestand also features a Matt Garza poster giveaway on Friday, May 1 to the first 7,500 fans, Rays Team Baseball Card Set to the first 10,000 kids 14 and under on Sunday, May 3 during Family Fun Day and a Cinco de Mayo Party on May 5 for the 4:08 p.m. game vs. Baltimore.

# View bridge progress

BELLEAIR – Belleair residents can now view the progress of Belleair Causeway Bridge using a new Web Cam that can be accessed online.

Residents can log on to [www.belleaircausewaybridge.com](http://www.belleaircausewaybridge.com) and click on the Belleair Web Cam on the bottom left-hand side.

A live camera shows, in real time, the construction operations of the Belleair Causeway Bridge. Camera views can be adjusted to watch from the north, south, east and west, and includes the option to zoom.

Work on the bridge continues to accelerate and initial benchmarks are being made on the new Belleair Causeway Bridge construction, which began on March 29, 2007.

Since opening in 1950, the existing Belleair Causeway Bridges have served as a key access route to the 20-plus miles of pristine Pinellas County beaches.

However, the antiquated bridges have reached their lifespan capacity and are due to be replaced.

The new Belleair Causeway Bridge represents an extensive construction project and a multi-million dollar investment in local communities. It is funded, in part, through Penny for Pinellas dollars and is slated for completion in the spring of 2010.

# Nesting season

Sea turtle nesting season has begun on Florida's beaches, which means beach residents and visitors need to follow a few precautions to ensure a successful season. Lights along the beach should be managed to prevent disorienting a female that comes ashore at night, according to biologists with the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission.

### New North County Utilities "Payment Drop Box"

CLEARWATER – A new Pinellas County Utilities payment drop box is being installed at 29582 U.S. Highway 19 North in Clearwater for the convenience of north county customers.

The drop box will be in service beginning Monday, May 4, 2009 and is in response to customer requests for a convenient payment option following the 2007 closing of the branch office on Tampa Road in Palm Harbor. Payments put in the drop box before 12:00 p.m. will be processed on the same day.

### 38th Avenue N. to close for road improvements

PINELLAS COUNTY – On Tuesday, May 5, Pinellas County Public Works will close 38th Avenue N., between 33rd Street North and 31st Street N. in St. Petersburg, for road improvements. The expected road closure is approximately 107 days, pending weather conditions.

All vehicles, bicyclists and pedestrians are directed to the following alternate routes: 54th Avenue to the north and 22nd Avenue to the south.

Travelers may then take U.S. Hwy. 19 to destinations west of the road closure or 16th Street, Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Street (formerly Ninth Street) or Fourth Street for destinations east of the road closure. All truck traffic east of the road closure must use Fourth Street N.

The scope of this work will require the entire roadbed and under-drain system to be removed and upgraded, necessary due to groundwater conditions compromising the road pavement. The contractor is Pepper Contracting Services, Inc.

### Pinellas County Animal Services celebrates National Pet Week in May

PINELLAS COUNTY – Looking for a new best friend or family member? National Pet Week is observed the first full week in May, and Pinellas County Animal Services celebrates by offering reduced adoption costs for pets. As part of the celebration, \$1 rabies vaccinations with the purchase of a license will be available for dogs and cats.

The adoption fee in May for cats and dogs has been reduced to \$20. That low fee means a medical work-up that includes spaying/neutering, vaccination series, internal and external parasite control, heartworm testing and feline leukemia testing. A required Pinellas County license is provided too.

The loving families that adopted 5,496 pets last year from Animal Services know the many advantages of welcoming a pet from a shelter. 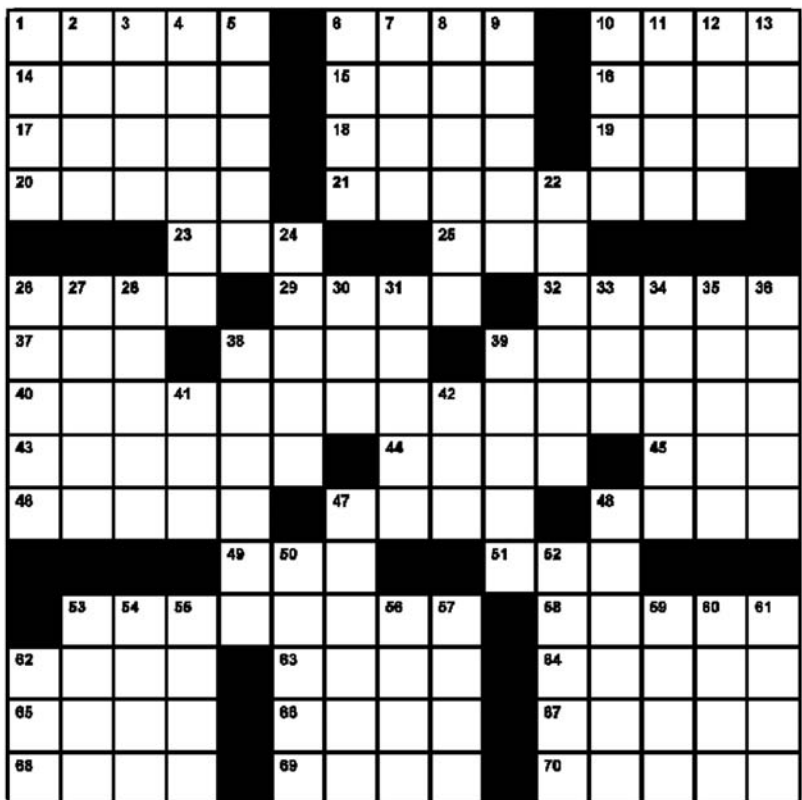
