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Does Prohibition Prohibit?

Of course it does not. Haven't we heard it stated by every one who favors whiskey and more whiskey?

Haven't we heard it stated time and again that if the county goes dry there will be more sold than before? Then haven't we heard it argued in the next breath that it will kill the town because whiskey won't be sold here?

If there will be more sold here under prohibition than under the open saloon then it's about time for those who are voting "wet" to keep from killing business to make a rush for the front seat in the "dry" band wagon, because according to their belief a town is a "hummer" where you can get plenty of booze and more booze.

Sam Jones answers the argument about selling more whiskey in a county when it's dry than when it's wet, very forcible. He says: "Don't they sell all the whiskey they can when the saloons are open? Well then when a county is dry they sell more than they can."

Now, they either sell more whiskey in a county when it is dry than when it is wet or they don't. Our wet friends must take either one position or the other. If they take the position that more is sold

when the county is dry then they must stop arguing that "dry" will kill the town because they pretend to believe that lots of whiskey in a town builds up business.

If on the other hand they admit that less whiskey is sold in a dry county than in the same county when it is wet, then they must vote dry because they cannot conscientiously vote for a thing that increases poverty, immorality and crime, for a money consideration. No man can afford to barter his soul for a few paltry dollars. No man can afford to place poison to his neighbors' lips for gold. No man can afford to place a temptation before his neighbor and friend that will wreck that neighbor and friend's home. No man can afford to be so selfish.

But prohibition does not prohibit. There is whiskey sold in dry counties. It is sold in Leon and Suwannee. Haven't you heard that statement? And the statement is probably true. Madison county is going dry and there will be blind tigers here too. But name a law that does entirely prohibit what it intended to prohibit.

Shall we repeal the law against murder?

The law against murder has failed to entirely prohibit.

Shall we repeal the laws against stealing?

They do not entirely stop stealing.

But we are answered, whiskey selling is not in itself a criminal act and is only made so by law. Alright.

Shall we repeal the game law, it does not entirely stop the killing of game out of season?

The killing of birds or deer is not a criminal act in itself and is only made so by statute. Because there is an occasional violation of

the game law, shall we make a complete surrender to the few law breakers, and repeal the game law and let the wholesale slaughter of game go on for a while and entirely destroy all game in this section, or shall we admit that the game law is a good thing because it prevents a wholesale slaughter and keeps the killing of game out of season down to a minimum?

Of course, there will be an occasional blind tiger in Madison county after it goes dry, but we will have stopped up the bung hole. We have a good sheriff who can look after the small leaks.—Madison Recorder.
