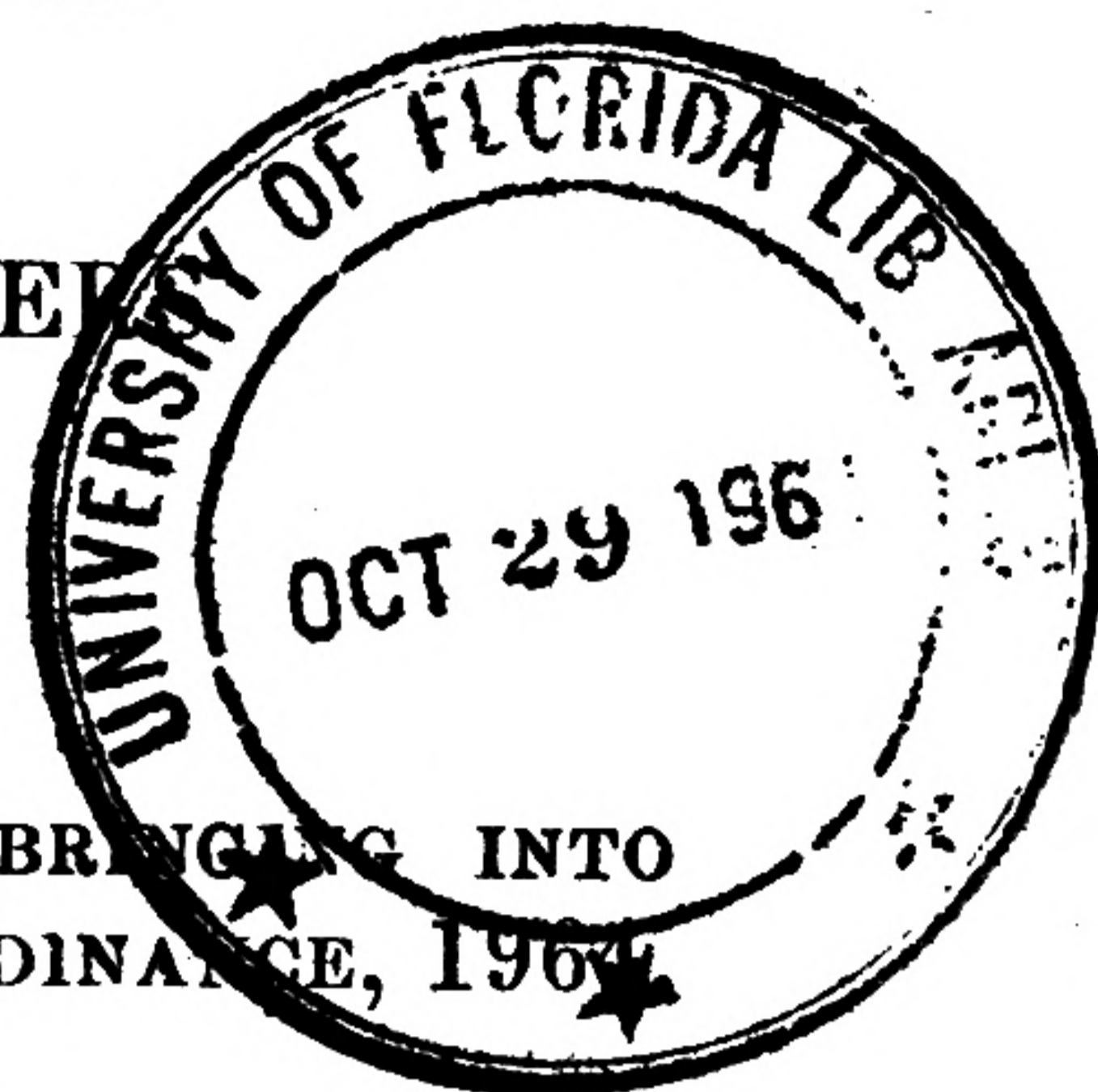

PROCLAMATION DATED SEPTEMBER 10, 1964, BRINGING INTO OPERATION THE FACILITIES FOR TITLE ORDINANCE, 1964

BY THE ACTING ADMINISTRATOR OF THE VIRGIN ISLANDS.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by section 38 of the Facilities for Title Ordinance, 1964, it is provided that the said Ordinance shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Administrator by proclamation published in the Gazette.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, HUGH BURROWES, Acting Administrator of the Virgin Islands, do by this my proclamation declare that the said Ordinance shall come into operation on the 1st day of October, 1964.

AND all her Her Majesty's officers and loving subjects in the Colony and all others whom it may concern are hereby required to take due notice hereof and to give their ready obedience accordingly.

GIVEN at the Administrator's Office at Tortola, in the Virgin Islands, this 10th day of September 1964, and in the thirteenth year of Her Majesty's reign.

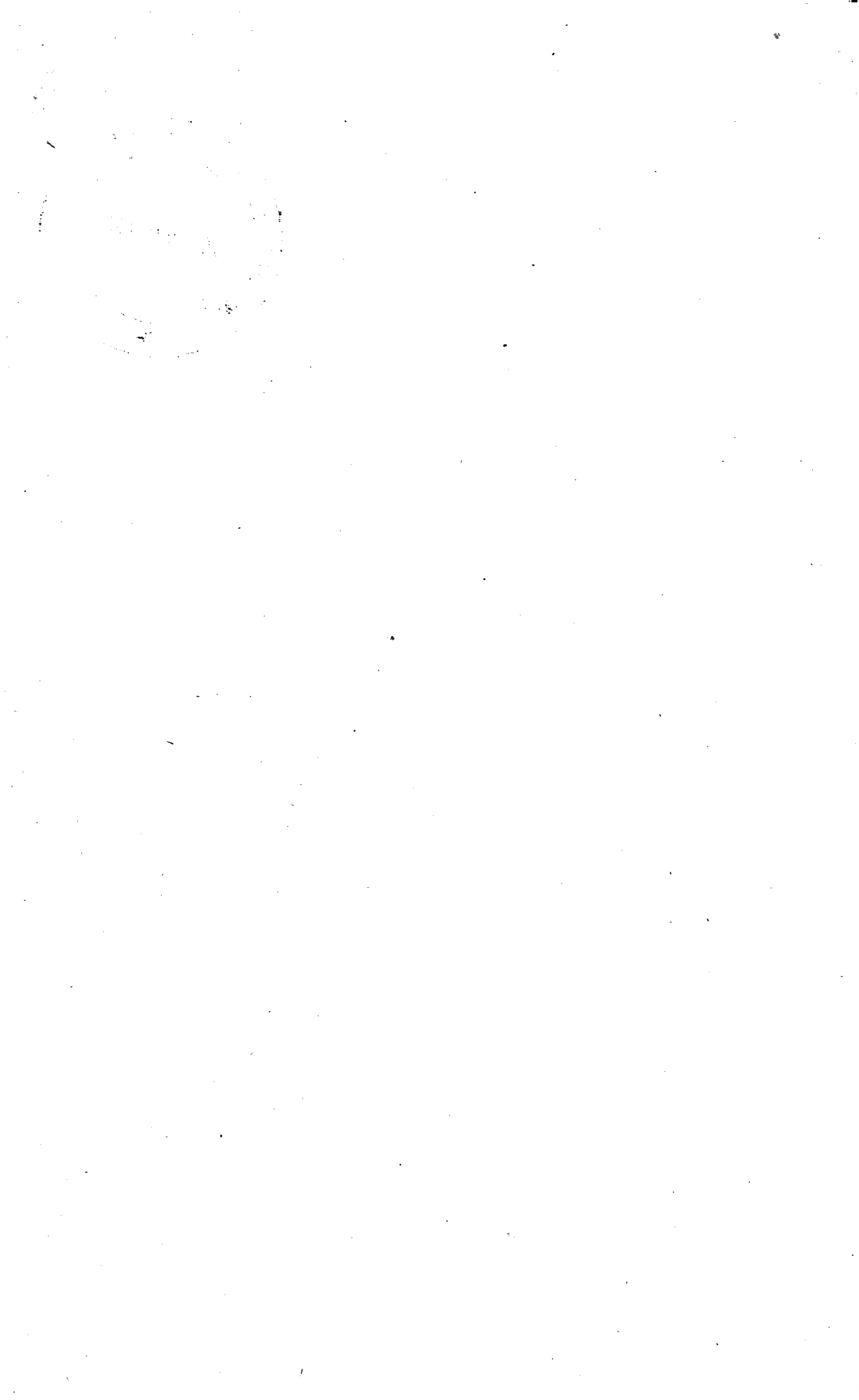

PENSIONABLE OFFICES

THE PENSIONABLE OFFICES ORDER, 1964 DATED 22ND SEPTEMBER, 1964, MADE BY THE ADMINISTRATOR IN COUNCIL UNDER SECTION 2(1) OF THE PENSIONS ACT, 1947 (No 12 OF 1947).

1. **Short Title.** This Order may be cited as the Pensionable Offices Order, 1964.

2. **Pensionable Offices.** The offices specified in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be pensionable offices within the meaning of the Pensions Act, 1947.

3. **Revocation.** The Pensionable Offices Order, 1959 (S.R. & O. 1959, No. 36) is hereby revoked.

4. **Commencement.** This Order shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1962.

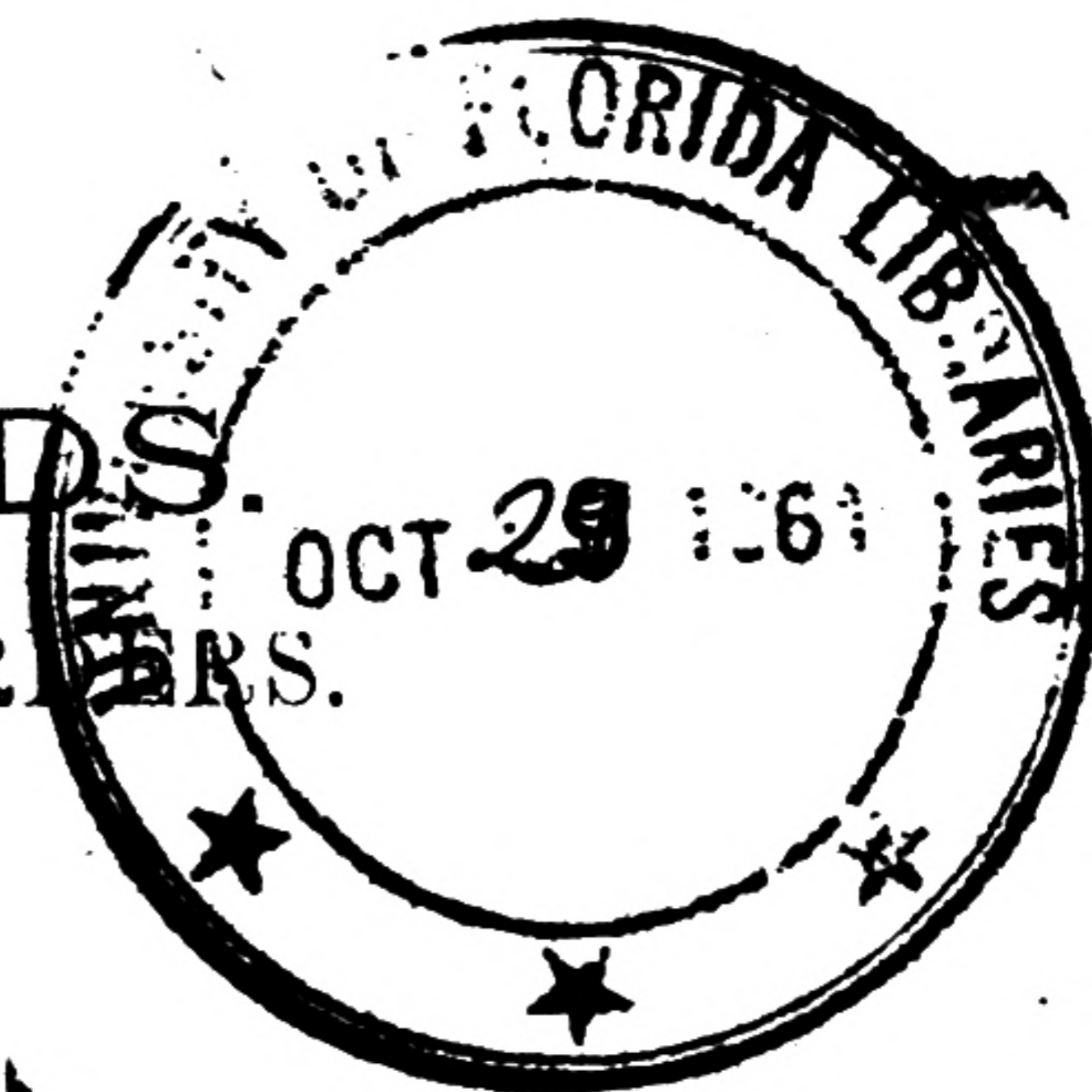

BILL FOR

An Ordinance to amend the Government Electricity, Ice and Cold Storage Ordinance, 1956 (No. 36 of 1956).

[]

Be it enacted by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council of Antigua, and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Government Electricity, Ice and Cold Storage (Amendment) Ordinance, 1964, and shall be read as one with the Government Electricity, Ice and Cold Storage Ordinance, 1956, hereinafter called the principal Ordinance.

Short title.

36/1956.

2. The principal Ordinance is amended as follows:—

Amendment of principal Ordinance.

(i) by adding the following to paragraph (m) of subsection (1) of section 29—

“the fees to be paid for inspection of installations and apparatus;”;

(ii) by inserting the following new section as section 41 thereof—

“Recovery of fees, expenses, etc.

41. Any fee, expenses, or other moneys recoverable under this Ordinance, recovery of which is not otherwise specially provided for, shall be a civil debt recoverable summarily without limit of amount.”;

(iii) by renumbering sections 41 and 42 as sections 42 and 43 respectively.

OBJECTS AND REASONS.

The object of this Bill is to amend the Government Electricity, Ice and Cold Storage Ordinance which deals (*inter alia*) with the generation and supply of electricity, to provide a statutory remedy by civil action for the recovery of moneys due under the Ordinance in addition to the power given by section 21 thereof to cut off the electricity supply, and to empower the Administrator in Council to prescribe fees for the inspection of installations.
