An Ordinance to amend further the Minerals (Vesting) Ordinance, 1948.

BE IT ORDAINED by the Governor and Legislative Council of Antigua as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the Minerals (Vesting) (Amendment) Ordinance, 1954, and shall be read as one with the Minerals (Vesting) Ordinance, 1948, as amended, hereinafter called the Principal Ordinance.

2. Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the following definition between the definitions of the expressions “to mine” and “Treasurer”:—

““to prospect” with its grammatical variations and cognate expressions means to search for minerals and includes such working as is reasonably necessary to enable the prospector to test the mineral-bearing qualities of the land;”.

3. Section 4 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows:—
