

circumstances of the accident and adding any observations which the court thinks right to make;

(f) the court may require the expenses incurred in and about an investigation under this section (including the remuneration of any persons appointed to act as assessors) to be paid in whole or part by any person summoned before it who appears to the court to be, by reason of any act or default on his part or on the part of any servant or agent of his, responsible in any degree for the occurrence of the accident, but any such expenses not required to be so paid shall be paid out of the general revenues of the Presidency;

(g) any person who without reasonable excuse (proof whereof shall lie on him) either fails, after having had the allowances, travelling expenses and fees (if any) to which he is entitled tendered to him, to comply with any summons or requisition of the court, or prevents or impedes the court in the execution of its duty, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding fifty dollars or to imprisonment for a term not exceeding three months, and, in the case of a failure to comply with the requisition for making any return or producing any document, if the failure in respect of which a person was so convicted is continued after the conviction, he shall be guilty of a further offence and shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine of twenty-five dollars for every day on which the failure was so continued.

(2) The Governor in Council may cause the report of the court to be made public at such time and in such manner as he thinks fit."
