STATUTORY RULES AND ORDERS.

1955, No. 27.

ORDER OF THE GOVERNOR DATED AUGUST 23, 1955, UNDER ARTICLE 13 OF THE LEEWARD ISLANDS LETTERS PATENT 1953 DECLARING THAT THE EXECUTIVE COUNCIL OF THE PRESIDENCY OF SAINT CHRISTOPHER NEVIS AND ANGUILLA ESTABLISHED BY THE EXISTING LETTERS PATENT SHALL CEASE TO EXIST.

1. CITATION. This Order may be cited as the Saint Christopher Nevis and Anguilla Executive Council (Cessation) Order, 1955.

2. DATE OF CESSATION OF EXISTENCE OF EXECUTIVE COUNCIL. From the 15th day of September, 1955, the Executive Council in the Presidency of Saint Christopher Nevis and Anguilla established under the Existing Letters Patent, that is to say:—

Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the Realm constituting the Office of Governor and Commander in Chief of the Leeward Islands and dated the seventeenth day of November, 1936.

Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the Realm dated the twenty-eighth day of December, 1939, amending the aforesaid Letters Patent of the seventeenth day of November, 1936.

Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the Realm dated the twelfth day of July, 1943, amending the aforesaid Letters Patent of the seventeenth day of November, 1936.

Letters Patent passed under the Great Seal of the Realm dated the fifteenth day of January, 1951, amending the aforesaid Letters Patent of the seventeenth day of November, 1936,

shall cease to be the Executive Council of the said Presidency.
