Dear Farris:

As requested, I have arranged for you to meet with local officials on the afternoon of Friday, August 5th. Detailed plans for that afternoon are recited on the attached schedule and are firm at this end, subject only to your final approval.

The Saturday plans listed on the schedule are not as complete. The morning presents no real problem. Dink and I have discussed the pros and cons of a "dutch treat" breakfast as opposed to the coffee, and I am inclined to settle on the latter as suggested in your letter. Dink, however, would really prefer a breakfast and, if it is of no particular consequence to you, I would readily concur in a switch. We should move it up to about 8:30 on the schedule, though, and should hold it on the Mayflower Roof.

The balance of Saturday is not yet subject to a final report, simply because I have been unable to reach Pleas Gay. I hope to advise you further very shortly as to that part of your visit.

In the meantime, let me know whether Friday's program as stated is ready to be confirmed and what is your preference as to the Saturday morning affair.

Biba and I are definitely planning on you and Julia staying with us at the Beach. With the Expressway, the time factor is no longer a problem and Biba can take Julia in or out whenever desired. We hope that you won't have
