### Bryant Visit

Farris Bryant, making a bid for support in Northwest Florida, will arrive in Crestview at 3 P.M. Tuesday for a short speech and handshaking tour.

The gubernatorial candidate is scheduled to continue his tele-stumping campaign with appearances on WEAR-TV, Pensacola, at 8:30 P.M. Monday and WDM-TV at 8:30 P.M. Tuesday.

Bryant will begin his tour of Northwest Florida Monday by visiting Quincy, Chattahoochee, Marianna, Chipley, Bonifay, Defuniak Springs, and Pensacola. Before arriving in Crestview Tuesday he will speak and shake hands in Milton.

Now in his third week of active campaigning, mostly by television, Bryant reports that his forces are growing stronger daily.

"We have reached the people in every television area in the state," Bryant said, "and the response has been wonderful. The reaction has shown that the people of Florida want a Governor who will serve them honestly, without obligation to large money interests or a big machine."

Bryant stopped campaigning shortly after qualifying because of lack of funds. He said that the professional political investors refused to back his race because they knew they would receive no better treatment than the man who had contributed nothing.

He decided to stay in the race after supporters in Marion County raised sufficient money for him to conduct a limited television campaign. By appealing to the average man who wants only honest government, they raised enough money to keep Bryant on television five nights a week throughout the campaign.

Bryant's managers report that contributions are coming into headquarters in a steady stream and they are assured of adequate funds

to properly present Bryant's cause to the public.

Bryant's state campaign managers are Jimmy Kynes, native of Marianna and now an Ocala attorney, and Willard Ayres, former state representative from Marion County.
