Dear Farris:

With regard to a January meeting of the Executive Committee, I wonder how your calendar looks for 29 January? I find that the College has conferences taking place on the 15th and 22nd January. If you find the 29th January satisfactory, please let me know and I shall send out invitations to the Executive Committee for a 10:00 A.M. to 1:00 P.M. meeting to be followed by lunch.

I also enclose the draft of a suggested afternoon meeting along the lines of that held at Ponte Vedra. I am taking the liberty of sending copies of this letter, together with the outline to Carroll, Helliswell, Page and Poynter, who were instrumental in setting up the Ponte Vedra meeting. I hope that they will give you their reaction to this suggestion.

After consultation with the Rollins authorities, I find that the College does not feel able to absorb the costs of such a conference. Therefore, unless we can find an individual willing to underwrite it, the cost of the luncheon would have to come out of FCCCH funds. Naturally, I would be happy to handle the correspondence and house-keeping activities. As noted on the outline, the purposes would be primarily those of publicizing the FCCCH and spurring fund raising. I believe that to secure wide attendance at such an annual conference as this, it would be imperative that we obtain participants of state-wide reputation. That would include, of course, yourself, Don Carroll and Ted David. I found that George Williams would join us; how about Governor Collins? Will you give this tentative outline your consideration and let me know the reaction of yourself and the others?
