Governor Bryant has named Thomas Moore, president of the ABC Television Network to membership on Florida's Council of 100.

Moore, a native Mississippian, worked his way up in radio and TV to the presidency of ABC, one of the three giant radio and TV networks in the nation and second largest in the world.

Moore has taken an active interest in Florida, giving personal attention to the development of the several ABC outlets in the state. He selected Miami's Orange Bowl Kickoff Banquet for the presentation of the annual athletic award of ABC for ABC's Wide World of Sports telecast.

The ABC president joins a distinguished quartet of Floridians-by-proxy who take an active interest in Council of 100 Membership. Council Chairman Fred O. (Bud) Dickinson calls often on members Walter Cronkite, Columbia Broadcasting system newscaster and personality and managing editor of the evening edition of CBS News; Arthur Godfrey, radio and TV star; Malcolm A. MacIntyre, president of Eastern Air Lines, one of the major Florida carriers, and R. B. McNeill, Jr., president of the Manufacturers Hanover Trust Company of New York, a major American financial institution.
