- Education:** Graduated from Croukville High School in May, 1932, with rank of 3rd in class of 52 graduates. Due to Depression and young age, continued with post-graduate work at same school for four additional semesters.
- Graduated from Meredith Business College, Zanesville, Ohio in May, 1936, majoring in Cost Accounting. Ranked first in class.
- Experience:** May, 1936 - May, 1944. Cost Accountant for the Dunsmuir Construction Company, Zanesville, Ohio. Annual salary - \$8,000.
- May, 1944 - March, 1946. United States Air Force. Assigned to radio and radar technical school. Without prior experience in this field, graduated as valedictorian in class of several thousand. Assigned to B-29 squadron in 2nd Air Force. Served no over-seas duty. Completed service as manager of MCO club at Clovis AFB, New Mexico. Highest rank - Sergeant. Honorable discharge. Serial No. 35236668.
- March, 1946 - July, 1947. U. S. Treasury, Internal Revenue Service. In September, 1946, after six weeks of special Treasury Department tax school in Chicago (ranked 5th in final examination for 44 instructors from 22 states), named Deputy Collector Instructor at Columbus, Ohio, for Field Division covering 26 counties. Extensive experience in income tax fraud cases working closely with Intelligence Division of Treasury Department. Annual salary - \$4,000 (estimated).
- July, 1947 - September, 1948. Tax Consultant and Traveling Auditor for White Chevrolet Company, Zanesville, Ohio. Including parent company, work covered agencies at Dayton, Toledo and Sylvania, Ohio, and Petersburg, Michigan. Also supervised real estate developments including razing and redevelopment of alum areas. Annual salary - \$6,200.
- September, 1948 - November, 1954. Self-employed. Public Accounting, Auditing and Tax Consultant work. Most important single undertaking during this period was appointment as Assistant to the Receiver of Lustron Corporation, Columbus, Ohio. Company was put into receivership after spending \$37,500,000 of a Reconstruction Finance Corporation loan commitment of \$52,500,000. Extensive investigative and auditing work in connection with this assignment culminated in testifying as to the activities of Lustron management before Senate Banking Committee in Washington. Average annual earnings during self-employed period - \$7,200.
- November, 1954 - February, 1956. General Manager of The Central Ohio Products Company, Columbus, Ohio, an automotive accessory manufacturing concern; and General Manager and Assistant Secretary of The Midwest Oil and Gas Company, a corporation engaged in oil and gas drilling and pro-

duction. In complete charge of both firms simultaneously. Annual salary - \$7,400 plus over-riding oil royalty interest.

February, 1956 - February, 1959. Executive Assistant to Mr. James F. White, President of Jim White Chevrolet Company, Toledo, Ohio. Financial Analyst, Auditor and Tax Consultant for 7 automobile agencies and 3 real estate holding corporations. Oil and gas drilling and production management for holdings in 5 states. Supervision of new real estate developments. Advisor on securities portfolio and other confidential work for president. Annual salary - \$10,500.

February, 1959 - February, 1962. State of Ohio, Assistant Director of Commerce. Exercised administrative and fiscal control over the following divisions within the Department of Commerce: Division of Aviation, Division of Banks, Division of Building and Loan Associations, Division of Economic Development and Publicity, Division of State Fire Marshal, Division of Private Employment Agencies, Division of Real Estate, and Division of Securities. The latter division exercised state-wide control over security brokers and salesmen; registration and qualification of all security issues offered for sale within the state; licensing and examination of small loan companies; licensing and auditing of credit unions; registration of oil and gas wells drilled within or without the state if shares were offered to Ohio residents; and registration and personal examination of out-of-state real estate developments being offered or advertised within the state.

Testified before many State Legislative Committees on proposed legislation affecting Department of Commerce authority. Advised Governor and his staff as to current status of pending bills and budgetary implications. Attended weekly Cabinet meetings to discuss affairs of state. Designated by Governor as Ohio's official representative to the Interstate Oil Compact Commission and member of the Commission's Executive Committee 1959-61. Made speeches before various groups on subjects relating to the Department of Commerce. Headed Small Business Counseling Service, an adjunct of Ohio Department of Commerce working with the Small Business Administration. Employees in the Department of Commerce numbered 240. Annual salary - \$11,760.

February, 1962 - January, 1963. State of Ohio, Deputy Director of Finance and Superintendent of Purchases and Printing. Chief Procurement Officer for the State of Ohio with procurement volume of approximately \$90,000,000 annually. Head of the Data Processing Center of the Department of Finance providing the major agencies of state government with the most up-to-date data processing services available. Notable areas included Finance Appropriation Accounting; Personnel records, payrolls and statistics; Education; Health (including state-wide vital statistics); Insurance, Mental Hygiene and Correction; Natural Resources; Public Welfare; Public Works; Real Estate; and other various licensing Boards and Commissions. Responsible for all state printing contracts and state bindery; also for Quality Control program, state purchasing specifications, purchasing on term contracts, and disposition of salvage and surplus property. Direct supervision of 206 employees. Annual salary - \$12,720.
